The fair will run through Sunday, January 29, with a kickoff celebration on the opening night from 7pm to 10pm featuring live performances by musical guest Ohr, and performance art by Allison Wyper and Erika Katrina Barbosa. Fair visitors, collectors, press, curators, and art lovers are invited to join us and experience the new work of contemporary artists from across the United States and abroad. Hollywood's historic Highland Gardens Hotel's rooms will be transformed into exhibition spaces by 50+ artists, small collectives, and the fair's Los Angeles non-profit partners, offering viewers an intimate experience with contemporary art — via stARTup's unprecedented access to the artists themselves.

Explore hotel rooms as art exhibitions

Experience our rigorously-vetted group of exhibiting artists throughout the stimulating 3-day weekend. Participants include: second-time stARTup artist, <u>Audrey Heller</u> (Room 129), whose uniquely miniature sculptures play with the weight of "feeling small," and the politics, humor, and spirituality that accompany that specific sensation. Artist <u>Kimberlee Koyumi-Murteira</u> (Room 225) uses materials ranging from glass bottles and cereal bag liners to video projections and water in order to create installations that mirror the disorientation and brief moments of clarity that are inevitable in the human experience. The opposing forces of LA's wealth and poverty, purity and corruption are illustrated by <u>Wayne Chang</u> (Room 220) via paintings comprised of errily juxtaposing images of everyday life and strange, unfamiliar settings.

Los Angeles Visual Arts Nonprofits exhibit at stARTup

In addition to these exhibiting artists, stARTup Art Fair Los Angeles will feature curated rooms and special projects from local nonprofit partners 18th Street Arts Center, The Torrance Art Museum, PØST's Friction, a series of works that explore identity and politics of the individual and the collective, and a group showing by Los Angeles-based emerging artists, Andree Carter and Richard Gayler, curated by the Los Angeles Art Association.

Experience Special Projects

In addition to our Selection Committee-vetted exhibiting artists and cultural nonprofit partners, stARTup Art Fair Los Angeles will feature:

- The Lancaster Museum of Art and History will hold artist portfolio reviews during the three days of the fair with gallerists Walter Maciel and Charlie James, and Andrew Hosner of Thinkspace Gallery
- Personal "Art Tarot" readings by performance artist <u>Alexia Lewis</u> in which the artists' custom-made card deck and ritualistic performance generates advice, support, and a list of actions for the recipient to take.
- Special performance by <u>Jenifer Yeuroukis</u> and <u>StevenMichaelArts</u>: <u>Sirenum scopuli</u>,
 a video projection and live performance collaboration exploring the the intersection of
 gender, race, consumerism and physical destruction.
- A curated exhibition of sculpture by <u>David O. Johnson</u>, video installations by <u>Yoshie</u>
 Sakai, and neon works by <u>Lisa Schulte</u> in the Lobby and <u>Greg Schenk</u> the courtyard.

• A **stARTup Art Fair mobile app** that allows visitors to scan artwork to provide additional information, create a shortlist of favorite artworks, and purchase pieces directly through the app which you can download for free here before and during the fair.

Delve deeper into the art world with panel discussions and tours

All Art Conversations take place in **Room 122**. Topics, among others, include:

- Approaching Museums, moderated by Max Presneill (Director and Head Curator) and Maurizzio Pineda (Assistant Curator) of the Torrance Art Museum. Learn about working with small contemporary art museums, how to approach them, realistic expectations, and the do's and don'ts to help artists in getting closer to their goals.
- The Hybrid Practice: Art & Entrepreneurship, moderated by performance artist
 Allison Wyper, with panelists Kristine Schomaker (Shoebox PR), Stephanie
 Diamond (Listings Project), and Kio Griffith (independent curator / artist / writer). Take
 a closer look at the independent artist-entrepreneur: How and why to start a business to
 support one's art, different shapes artistic careers might take, and how one leverages
 their skills as artists to make an impact or fill a need outside the studio.
- Collector Roundtable, moderated by Peter Mays (Los Angeles Art Association). Hear
 personal approaches and strategies for collecting and appreciating contemporary art
 from a cadre of top collectors. Gain insight on how collectors seek out new talent and
 acquisitions.
- Getting Attention--is a Review all You Need?, with critic/curators Shana Nys

 Dambrot and Peter Frank. How do artists get their work seen and written about? What is the value of an art review in this process, what else does an artist need for success, and what is "success," anyway?
